

Ohio Libraries Transform

- Gov. Kasich's budget proposal would cut state funding to Ohio's public libraries by more than \$7 million in FY 2018 by reducing the Public Library Fund (PLF) from 1.7% of the state's General Revenue Fund (GRF) to 1.66% of the GRF.
- More than 8.7 million Ohioans are public library card holders. Nearly 4 out of every 5 Ohio residents is a registered library card holder.
- Ohio's public libraries have the HIGHEST USE per capita in the nation.
- For every \$1 spent by Ohio's public libraries, more than \$5 in economic value is returned to Ohioans.
- 58 public libraries in the state DO NOT have a local property tax levy and rely solely on their state funding through the PLF as their primary source of revenue for day-to-day operations and providing services to their communities.
- Public libraries DO NOT have the ability to raise local revenue through a local sales tax or income tax; and they DO NOT receive casino revenue.
- State funding for public libraries through the PLF makes up 49% of the total funding for Ohio's public libraries.
- State funding for Ohio's public libraries through the PLF is essential in the delivery of services to Ohioans.

Ohio's public libraries are encouraging legislators to:

- NOT CUT state funding to Ohio's public libraries.
- Maintain state funding for public libraries at 1.7% of the GRF.
- Hold public libraries harmless from any additional unintended reductions by guaranteeing the PLF receives no less than the FY 2017 total distribution.
