Registering to Vote

To vote in Ohio you must:

- ✓ register at least 30 days before Election Day;
- ✓ be a citizen of the United States;
- ✓ be at least 18 years old on or before the next general election; and
- ✓ be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days before the election (your residence is a location you consider your permanent dwelling).

Getting Started

1. **To register to vote, you must complete a voter registration form.** Go to www.MyOhioVote.com to access the online Voter Registration System, download a blank form, or request one be mailed to you by the Secretary of State's Office or your county board of elections. You may also pick up a voter registration form at a number of other places, including public libraries, public high schools, Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicle locations and the Department of Job and Family Services. For a complete list of locations, visit www.MyOhioVote.com.
2. **Properly complete the voter registration form, including all required information noted in the instructions.**
3. **Once you have completed your registration, return it by mail to the Secretary of State's office, your county board of elections or one of the locations listed previously in #1.** You will then be sent a notice from your county board identifying your polling location and precinct.
4. **You may check your voter information at www.MyOhioVote.com.** If the search does not return your information, please contact your county board of elections to check on the status of your registration.

Keep Your Registration Current

If you are registered to vote but have moved within Ohio and/or changed your name, you should update your voter registration at least 30 days prior to the election. You can do so by:

- submitting a new registration form with your new residence and/or name; or
- using the Online Voter Registration System available at www.MyOhioVote.com.

Your Options for Voting

Voting on Election Day

- Polls are open on Election Day from 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- You must cast your ballot at your designated polling place.
- If you do not know the location of your precinct or polling place, please contact your county board of elections or use the voter lookup tool available on the Secretary of State's website, www.MyOhioVote.com.
- Remember to bring an acceptable form of identification to the polls on Election Day.

Acceptable Form of Identification Examples

- A current and valid driver's license or state identification card
- An original or copy of a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections) that shows your name and current address.
- Military identification

If you have questions about the particular identification that you plan to use on Election Day, contact your local board of elections.

Absentee Voting by Mail

If you are a qualified Ohio voter and your registration is up to date, you are eligible to cast an absentee ballot.

- Absentee voting begins the day after the close of voter registration.
- You must request that an absentee ballot be mailed to you no later than noon on the Saturday before an election, though you should request an absentee ballot as early as possible to have time to receive, vote and return your ballot.
- You may also download a request form at www.MyOhioVote.com.

- Absentee ballot application forms are available from the Secretary of State's office or your county board of elections.

Once you receive your absentee ballot, vote your ballot and seal it in the identification envelope provided. Be sure to provide all of the information required on the ID envelope.

You may then return the ballot either by mail (must be received by your board of elections prior to 7:30 p.m. on Election Day or postmarked no later than the day before the

election) or in person to your county board of elections office (must be received by the close of polls on Election Day).

Early In-Person Absentee Voting

Starting the day after the close of voter registration, you may cast your absentee ballot in person at your county board of elections or voting center as designated by the county. Check with your county board of elections for more specific information.

Common Reasons for Voting a Provisional Ballot

Any of the following scenarios would require you to cast a provisional ballot on Election Day. For a complete list, visit www.MyOhioVote.com.

- You are not registered to vote or did not update your address at least 30 days prior to the election.
- You are unable or decline to provide an acceptable form of identification (see list on previous panel).
- You already requested an absentee ballot for that election.

The content of a provisional ballot is the same as a regular ballot, but it is cast "provisionally" until election officials can verify your eligibility to vote.

If you cast a provisional ballot and did not provide an acceptable form of identification, you must appear in person at the board of elections within seven days immediately following Election Day with your ID for your ballot to be counted. Voter Registration Information

Eligibility
You are qualified to register to vote in Ohio if you meet all the following requirements:

1. You are a citizen of the United States.
2. You will be at least 18 years old on or before the next general election.
3. You will be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days immediately before the election in which you want to vote.
4. You are not incarcerated (in jail or prison) for a felony conviction under the laws of Ohio, another state or the United States.
5. You have not been declared incompetent for voting purposes by a probate court.
6. You have not been permanently denied the right to vote for violations of the election laws.

You are eligible to vote in elections in your voting precinct held at least 30 days after you are registered to vote in Ohio.

Submitting Your Voter Registration Form

Returning your own form:
You may return your completed voter registration form in person or by U.S. Mail to any of the following public offices:

- Any county board of elections;
- The Ohio Secretary of State's Office;
- BMV or Deputy Registrars;
- Office of designated agencies, including:
 - The Department of Job and Family Services;
 - The Department of Health (including the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program);
 - The Department of Mental Health;
 - The Department of Developmental Disabilities;
 - Opportunities for Ohioans With Disabilities; or
 - Any state-assisted college or university that provides assistance to disabled students;
- Any county treasurer's office;
- Any public high school or vocational school; or
- Any public library.

If you are updating your current Ohio voter registration and returning your completed change of name and/or address form by U.S. Mail, you must send it to your county board of elections or the Secretary of State's Office. Most registered voters in the state are also able to update their addresses online at www.MyOhioVote.com.

Returning someone else's form:
Anyone entrusted to return a completed voter registration form on behalf of another person must return the completed form to a board of elections or to the office of the Secretary of State. Forms must be returned the earlier of 1) within 10 days after the registration form is completed, or 2) by the voter registration deadline before an election if the registration form has been signed more than 24 hours before the registration deadline for the next upcoming election in the voter's precinct.

Notice from County Board of Elections
After receiving your properly completed voter registration form, your county board of elections must register you to vote and promptly notify you by mail of your precinct, polling location and the identification requirements for voting.

Registration Deadlines
Your properly completed voter registration form must be **postmarked** or **received** 30 days before the election in which you wish to vote. If the voter registration deadline falls on a day when offices of the Secretary of State and county board of elections are closed, the deadline is extended to the succeeding business day when the office is open.

Notice to All Voters
Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to verify identity. Identification may include current and valid photo identification, a military identification, or a copy of a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections) that shows the voter's name and current address. Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by providing the last four digits of the voter's Social Security number and by casting a provisional ballot pursuant to R.C. 3505.181.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is included in this packet?

This packet includes the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) form, the return envelope for your completed FPCA, and the Absentee Ballot Request (FPCA). You will also find additional information on the "Vote in Honor of a Veteran" program.

How do I register to vote? How do I request an absentee ballot?

Registering to vote and requesting for an absentee ballot are two steps in completing the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) form provided to you in this packet and returning it to your local election official. It is important that you complete this form and return it to your local election official as soon as possible.

How do I submit my Federal Post Card Application?

There are several ways to submit your Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). You can mail it to your local election official, or you can fax it to your local election official. You can also submit your FPCA online through the Ohio State Board of Elections website.

Can someone else request an absentee ballot on my behalf?

Yes, someone else can request an absentee ballot on your behalf. This is called a proxy ballot. You must complete a proxy ballot request form and return it to your local election official.

How will I receive my voted ballot? What is the deadline for return of the ballot?

Your absentee ballot cannot be returned electronically. There may be exceptions for U.S. Postal Service mail delivery services such as First-Class Mail, or private carriers. An absentee ballot must arrive at the local election official's office by the deadline for return of the ballot. It is important that you return your ballot as soon as possible.

How do I know that my local board of elections received my voted absentee ballot?

You will receive a tracking number from your county board of elections with your absentee ballot. You can use this tracking number to verify that your ballot was received by your local board of elections.

What happens if I mail a completed FPCA to my local board of elections but do not receive my absentee ballot?

If you have requested an absentee ballot but have not received a ballot, you should contact your local board of elections. You may also contact the Ohio Secretary of State's Office for assistance.

Why do I have to declare my proxy affiliation as primary?

Ohio law requires all voters who wish to vote in a proxy election to declare the party to which they wish to vote in the general election. A voter who does not declare a party affiliation is considered to be a proxy voter in the general election.

How can I find out the results of my election?

You can view the Ohio State Board of Elections website for election results.

What is Vote in Honor of a Veteran about?

This program is designed to honor service members and their families by encouraging them to vote. It provides information on how to register to vote and how to request an absentee ballot.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is included in the passport?

Included is your Ohio Voter Passport (FRCA) form, the request for your Ohio Voter Passport, and the request for your Ohio Voter Passport. The Ohio Voter Passport is a document that you will receive from the OSOS office.

How do I register to vote?

Registering to vote and applying to receive ballots can be done by completing the FRCA and submitting it to the OSOS office. A completed FRCA is a document that you will receive from the OSOS office.

Who may use the Federal Post Card Application?

The federal government and the State of Ohio permit the use of the FRCA by citizens who are registered to vote in the United States and who are currently residing in a foreign country.

How do I submit my Federal Post Card Application?

Ohio Public Safety Officials:
You put your lives on the line for Ohioans' safety every day.

As public safety professionals, I want to be sure you know your rights under the law to protect your personal information and families, while preserving your right to participate in Ohio elections.

Ohio law provides that peace officers, parole officers, probation officers, bailiffs, prosecuting attorneys, assistant prosecuting attorneys, correctional employees, youth services employees, firefighters, EMTs, or investigators of the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation may redact their home addresses from public databases, including Ohio's online voter rolls.

If one of these is your chosen profession, simply follow the steps in this packet to access and submit your address reduction form.

Protect Your Voting Address

To Protect Your Voting Address, Simply:



Keep Your Voting Address Current
Please remember that you must be registered to vote at your place of residence. You may not use your business address or a post office box number as your residential address for voting purposes.

Under Ohio law, you may petition to redact your home address from Ohio's online voter rolls if you serve in one of the following professions:

- Peace Officer
- Firefighter
- Emergency Medical Technician
- Prosecuting Attorney or Assistant Prosecuting Attorney
- Correctional Employee
- Parole Officer
- Probation Officer
- Bailiff
- Youth Services Employee
- Investigator With the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation




Safe at Home

Enacted by the General Assembly in 2016 and administered by my office, Safe at Home is an address confidentiality program that helps victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, stalking, rape and sexual battery shield their personal information from public record.

As Secretary of State, I am committed to making Ohio a place where it is easy to vote and hard to cheat. In realizing this goal, it is unacceptable that any Ohioan would ever have to choose between their personal liberty, like exercising their right to vote and their personal safety. This program provides abuse victims with a safe and secure way to participate in our democracy with ease.

Safe at Home is not intended to take the place of a safety plan, but rather is only part of a larger overall safety plan that victims should develop with an advocate.


Enrolling in Safe at Home does not automatically shield a program participant's address from public records.

A program participant's mail may be delayed several days.

A program participant with a confidential voter registration record should vote only by absentee ballot by mail.


A program participant must notify Safe at Home of an update to their information within 30 days of a change.

Certification lasts for four years. Program participants who are still eligible may submit an application for re-certification.

WHAT IS SAFE AT HOME?

Safe at Home (SAH) is an address confidentiality program that provides the following services:

Substitute Address
Safe at Home will assign program participants a substitute address. A program participant may request that a governmental entity use that address. A state of Ohio governmental entity must accept the substitute address of the program participant's request. A program participant may also request that a private entity use the substitute address, but the law does not require a private entity to accept it.

Mail Forwarding
Safe at Home will forward all qualifying mail to each program participant every day that the Secretary of State's office is open.

Confidential Voter Registration
Safe at Home program participants may register to vote with a confidential voter registration record. The registration information of a program participant with a confidential voter registration record will not be accessible to the public.

WHO MAY PARTICIPATE IN SAFE AT HOME?

An individual who is a victim of:

- domestic violence
- stalking
- human trafficking
- rape
- sexual battery
- or
- members of the household of a victim of one of the above offenses.

Safe at Home will not be as effective if the person that a program participant fears knows or could know where the program participant lives. The program is most effective when the program participant has just moved or is going to move in the immediate future.

Safe at Home is not:

- A witness protection program.
- Capable of shielding a program participant from legal obligation.
- A complete safety plan.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR SAFE AT HOME?

1. Find an Application Assistant certified by the Secretary of State's office: www.safeathomeohio.com 614-995-2255
2. Visit an Application Assistant and complete an application, and return it to the Safe at Home office at:

4. Begin using your new substitute address.
