### 6. Briefly describe any new partnerships or initiatives:

The ORTR task force, led by 2023-24 chair Julia Shaheen, developed and presented a statewide library conference, "Storytime Foundations," attended by 98 public library workers. This one-day conference devoted to storytime practice took place on April 30 at the State Library of Ohio. The event was based on the Five Practices from the Every Child Ready to Read® initiative. Keynote speakers Dr. Laura Justice (Crane Center for Early Childhood Research and Policy, Ohio State University) and Dr. Katie Campana (School of Information, Kent State University) contextualized public library workers' important work in support of young children and their families. Ten librarian-led breakout sessions explored storytime applications of the Five Practices. Access conference materials and further information here: https://ohreadytoread.org/storytime-foundations.

A subcommittee of the ORTR task force is developing a workshop version of Storytime Foundations that can be presented in different locations around the state by 2-3 facilitators per offering.

An ORTR Train-the-Trainer workshop was held in Columbus on December 2. Four experienced ORTR trainers facilitated this training for 10 prospective ORTR trainers representing five Ohio public library systems.

The Reimagining School Readiness team is developing circulating kits with items that enhance the RSR themes and activities, to be made available on loan to Ohio public libraries.
